1. Was there anything *new* for you from the message? Anything that needs clarification? We certainly understand God to be both loving and powerful, so we need the big picture when wrestling with this issue. And in accord with Deuteronomy 29:29, we won't expect to understand everything about God – especially given that he is infinite and we are his finite creatures. We begin with:

What's wrong with the world?

- 2. Read Genesis 3:1-7 (or 14). What was the nature of Adam and Eve's actions against God?
- 3. What do we understand was some of the profound impact of their rebellion? (Refer sermon and read Romans 8: 18-24)
- 4. How does understanding this context in which we now live, help us think about various sadnesses and tragedies we hear about and know of personally?

God's grand plan

- 5. How did mankind's rebellion impact God? (Refer Genesis 6:5-6)
- 6. In short, what is his grand plan to do something about it? (Refer Revelation 21:1-4 for a glimpse!)
- 7. Central to this grand plan is the Lord Jesus whose resurrection shows his power over evil and death. See Hebrews 2:14; 2 Timothy 1:10. How did Jesus' death and resurrection prove God's power over evil and the evil one?

What is he waiting for?

- 8. If God has already therefore been victorious over evil, why doesn't he just wind everything up and bring in the new heavens and the new earth now? (See 2 Peter 3:8-9)
- 9. There is an amnesty at present: to all who repent, there is forgiveness and eternal life. If God is patient, wanting everyone to come to repentance, what are the implications for us as a church who long to see more disciples of Jesus?

What do we do in the mean time?

- 10. We don't have all the answers. Yet we know why the world's in a mess; we know God's grand plan and we know why he is waiting. Why doesn't God just step in and prevent more sad/bad stuff from happening?
- 11. What are we promised as we go through difficult times? See Psalm 46:1-2, Romans 8:18 then vv38-39; and James 1:2-5. Are there other promises which you also claim in difficult times?

Take some time to thank God for the new heavens and the new earth; to pray 'your kingdom come' and ask for grace to keep trusting him through the hard times even though we do not have all the answers.

Title: ...to tell you why sad things happen to good people.

Passage: Gen 3, Rom 8:18-24; Rev 21:1-4, 2 Peter 3

Aim: To show that mankind's rebellion had a profound impact on the universe... such that we do not live

in the world God first created... but that we are headed towards a new creation in which everything

will be perfected.

Romans 8:18-23

¹⁸I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us. ¹⁹ For the creation waits in eager expectation for the children of God to be revealed. ²⁰ For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope ²¹ that [a] the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the freedom and glory of the children of God.

²² We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. ²³ Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship, the redemption of our bodies.

- I have just 15 minutes to tell you why **sad** things happen to **good people**... and I'm grateful to the Rev'd Dr John Dickson for some of the thoughts in this message today...
- ...that's hardly long enough to do this topic justice... so it will only be introductory but my prayer is that it will
 give the big picture framework by which you can then go exploring some greater detail... and enough ground to
 keep trusting God for those areas we still can't fully comprehend....
- I don't need to spend any time **introducing** the topic as all of us have known great sadnesses which have happened to good people which have left us with deep **questions** about what God is up to in the **world**...
- ...and many people to conclude that either there is **no** God... or if there is, he either doesn't **care** or has no **power** to step in do something about the sad things that are happening in our world..
- Their **premise**? if God was an all **loving** as we're told and all **powerful** as we're told then what possible **reason** could there be for that **baby** to **die**...? for that **teenager** to be killed helping a couple following a road accident the other week near Orange...? Or what possible reason could there be for a building to collapse in Miami or that typhoon to cause the mudslide in Japan? Or closer to home my dear mate Ben Shaw a minister of the gospel, to die of a facial tumour aged 53?
- I have **no doubt** that every person watching today has had reason to **question** God about something that's been **sad** or **tragic** either in their own lives or in the lives of those close to them.
- So here's what I want to do in our time together: I want explore with you:
 - 1. what's wrong with the world?
 - 2. God's grand plan
 - 3. what is he waiting for?
 - 4. what we do in the meantime?
- So first:
- 1. WHAT'S WRONG WITH THE WORLD?
- it doesn't take long to see that the world *is* in a mess

- And it's been in a mess for a very long time...
- But what we don't fully understand or comprehend often enough is that the world is in a mess, because humankind has rejected God. //
- we are made for relationship with him... but we are capable of refusing /
- The Bible tells us that the world was thrown into chaos when Adam and Eve decided to do their own thing
- We **trivialise** that account as if it's about eating an **apple** or something like that... but when Adam and Eve chose independence **from** God... when they decided **they** would call the shots, // it had a **massive**, **profound impact** on the entire **universe** that we often **underestimate**.
- Our relationship with **God** broke down
- Our relationship with **one another** broke down
- Our relationship with **creation** broke down
- There is a confronting connection in the Bible between our **rebellion** against **God** and a certain **disorder** and **upheaval** in **creation itself**... from the **DNA** inside the **human body** to the **tectonic plates** under the **earth**. //
- Alongside the beauty of our world we see around us there is a certain ugliness... a profound disorder...
- And that means that sad things happen to ALL people good and bad... //
- From earthquakes, tsunamis, cyclones, bush fires... Cancer. MS. Parkinson's...
- The world is not as it was **created** to be... because of **mankind's rebellion**.
- It is seriously mucked up.
- It's a sad place. It has lost its shine... /
- Every time you hear of a death... a loss... a sadness... a grief... a war... a disaster... a famine... a king hit... when you confront the excesses of drugs and alcohol... when you head off for a funeral.... Even when you face the challenges and aches and pains of old age... when you face someone's bad temper... when someone offends you and mistreats you... those are all the effects of the mucked up world in which we live...! /
- And in the passage we read from Romans 8 we read that not only do we groan because of such things... but the whole creation groans... waiting for God to do something about it! //
- The reality is that we are all both **victims OF** and **contributors TO** human evil. I know **all too well**, the evil desires of my **own heart**. Perhaps **you** know / the evil desires of **your** heart!
- What's wrong with the world? Humankind declared independence from God and it had a profound and devastating impact....
- So... let's look at

2. GOD'S GRAND PLAN

- Do you know God's reaction at the rebellion of human kind?
- Here is what we read very early on Genesis 6:5-6 The Lord saw how great the wickedness of the human race
 had become on the earth, and that every inclination of the thoughts of the human heart was only evil all the
 time. 6 The Lord regretted or was grieved that he had made human beings on the earth, and his heart was
 deeply troubled.
- The Inclination of the human heart... only evil all the time... ... not a great assessment!
- God was grieved and deeply troubled. //
- And of course our first question is well why doesn't he do something about it...?
- And the answer is that the after the third chapter of the Bible, the rest of the entire library of books that we call
 our Bible <u>IS</u> God's grand plan to do something....!
- What IS this plan? /
- So radical is it, that the Bible describes it as a new creation... a new heavens and new earth...
- ...yes this one is destined to come to an end...

- What will the new heavens and earth be like? //
- ... **Multiply** all you love all that is **good** in this world by a factor of **thousands**... and you're nearing **something** of the awesome nature of the new creation...
- **MINUS** well what do you **loathe** about this creation? Warring, fighting, death, disease, cruelty, hate, bitterness, revenge... decay... fractured relationships...
- None of that will be present.... NONE of it... not even a tiny fraction... it will all be wiped out... dealt with gone!
- So; God / grieved that he had made mankind... hurt by their evil... had a grand plan to wipe out all evil... bring
 this creation to an end and usher in a beautiful magnificent new heavens and a new earth... without any evil or
 its impact.
- The plan is unfolded step by step in our Old Testament but centres around Jesus Christ.
- Jesus Christ as we saw two weeks ago is God on earth....
- he lived the perfect life we cannot live and he died the death we deserve. //
- But God's power is greater than all the world's evil and when Jesus rose from the dead, God declares victory
 over all evil... God rules... evil was defeated...
- And the final **step** in God's great plan before the new heavens and the new earth **begin**.... Is the return of Jesus... when we will wind up this world and usher in the new creation... // Hard to take in isn't it?
- Let me anticipate then, the most obvious question...

3. WHAT IS HE WAITING FOR?

- ...that is, if he's going to wind up the world and finally do **away** with all evil... over which he has **already** won the **victory** why not get on and **do it**?
- And the only answer in the Bible I can find is from 2 Peter 3:8-9 ...do not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.
- The **only** reason I can see in the Bible for holding **off** on sending Jesus **back** // is that a delay allows **more time** for **more people** to come into **relationship** with **him**....
- He longs that everyone should give up their rebellion and return to him... he longs for that.... //
- Maybe he's waiting for YOU today... for you to turn your life around and come back into relationship with him...
- He doesn't want you to die without knowing him...
- He doesn't want to **banish** you to keep you out from the new creation because you're still **stubbornly rebelling against him**... so **come** to him **today**! //
- So a grand plan a new creation made possible by the death and resurrection of Jesus... and in the meantime more opportunity for people to come to him...
- ...that's the big picture... //
- ...but it doesn't answer all our questions does it...? there are still things we find hard to wrestle with...
- So that brings me finally to:

4. WHAT DO WE DO IN THE MEAN TIME?

- That toddler run over in the driveway...
- That building collapse in Miami
- That teenager on the Mid-Western highway killed while rendering assistance to an older couple who had had an accident...
- Why don't you stop that sort of thing happening God while we wait for Jesus' return? //

- I don't fully know.
- Because the Bible teaches that God can do what he wants. He can and does move in human hearts! /
- But it is fascinating to have a closer look at what that might mean. //
- What kind of world would we be living in if God over-rode our will all the time? /
- What if every single time a crook wanted to pull a **trigger** on a gun, or a **husband** wanted to **betray** his **wife**, or a business **woman** wanted to withhold **resources** from the **poor**, or any scenario of evil you could dream up what if God **stepped in** and **overrode** the **will**?
- What kind of world would we live in?
- And why stop there?
- What if every time I wanted to keep all my money to myself, I found myself giving it away?
- What if when you wanted to raise your voice at your **spouse** you were strangely **silenced**?
- When you wanted to look at something you shouldn't on the internet, your modem disintegrated?
- Or you wanted to toot the horn impatiently at the driver in front and you found your left hand was strangely paralysed?
- You see, asking "why doesn't God step in and stop the evil?", raises all sorts of **other** questions.
- And you may say; "well Mark, not all the small stuff; only the really serious evil".
- But where would you draw the line?
- Before it anywhere near YOU? /
- What sort of world would that be if God stepped in to stop the evil?
- It wouldn't be a world where we are asking "why does God **allow evil**?" But we might be asking, the more difficult **philosophical** question 'why hasn't the creator made us with any **will**?' any **choice**?
- Brothers and sisters, if God were simply yet profoundly to put a stop to all evil NOW; I wouldn't be standing
 here preaching...!
- and YOU wouldn't be sitting there watching!
- So in the **meantime** we **don't can't** know all the answers...
- But we can know this:
- That he is **with** us in our **suffering**... Psalm 46:1-2: *God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble;* therefore we will not fear even though the mountains should fall into the sea...
- So we **run** to him as our **refuge**.. we draw **strength** from **his strength** and we **trust** that he's right here with **us!** in our troubles our sadnesses our troubles...
- And we know that he **knows** suffering... for in the person of **Jesus** he knew **persecution** and pain and **ridicule** and **death**...
- And we **trust** him... we trust that because he's given us His Son, he is utterly on our **side for** us and we know that **nothing** can ultimately **separate** us from his love... (Romans 8:38-39)
- So even though the way is hard <u>especially</u> when the way is hard we put our small hand into his big hand like a toddler with their mum or dad... and we feel safe... we rest assured even though we don't understand all that is happening around us.... //
- Why SO sad things happen to good people?
- Well sad things happen to all people good AND bad... // because the world is no longer perfect as when it
 was created.... Not perfect because although we were called to obey, but are capable of refusing.
- And when humanity at large refused, at that moment, the world was not all it once was. //
- But God promises a day. A day of justice. A day of comfort. A day of restoration and renewal when the new

creation will come and all that is bad and wrong about this world will be utterly gone.

- I say 'bring it on!' 'your kingdom come' //
- ... but in the meantime, keep **trusting** him... he **loves** you; he's **committed** to you... and even though you may not understand or indeed like what you're facing, he is with you in it... he will never leave you or forsake you...
- ...so run to him, rest in him; by all means take your questions to him... but trust him that he is utterly for you... Amen.
