

From our Bishop

Dear friends,

If you missed my recent sermon series on "WHY share Jesus for life?" you can catch all four talks <u>HERE</u>.

We looked firstly at Jesus'
COMPASSION for those who
were harassed and helpless –
like sheep without a shepherd.
Those around us who do not
know and love Jesus, are lost.
They have no one to guide
them, nurture them or give
them hope. When we see
people as Jesus saw them,
similar compassion rises up
within us, and we want to
share the joy of knowing Jesus!

We saw secondly that when we have a right and appropriate **REVERENCE** for God as the one who calls all to account, then we want to live in obedience to Jesus' command to 'GO and make disciples', realising that those without Jesus will be forever without him if they do not repent and believe.

Third, we looked at **LOVE**. God's love for us in the death of Jesus, humbles us, then compels us to share Jesus – especially as we realise we have been set apart as Christ's ambassadors! Our task as ambassadors is to urge people to 'be reconciled to God!', through Jesus, who became sin for us, that we might become right with him.

Finally, we saw the **COURAGE** of those Christians in the first century who were willing to suffer for Christ, even when it meant surrendering their property and going to jail! I asked in that sermon, whether we might have courage to share Jesus, knowing that it is unlikely we will ever suffer as they did!

Friends – share Jesus – for life!
